	A parent questionnaire was issued on the 6 th of January. The questionnaire response rate was 16%.	
	A similar pupil questionnaire was planned and a staff questionnaire was completed before Christmas.	
	S4-S5-S6 Subject Choice Process	
	Parents attended the course choice presentation evening, with a high turnout despite the challenging	
	weather.	
	Student SQA Ambassadors gave presentations which were all very well received.	
	Senior Pupils organisied an options fair for Nat5, Higher and Advanced Higher, which generated huge	
	interest with many S3s attending.	
	The S3-S4 options evening is to be held on the 23 rd . The online options form opens on Monday the 3 rd	
	with a deadline for completion on the 10 th of February.	
	A question was raised on the minimum numbers for a subject choice to run, particularly in relation to new subjects. In response it was noted that the school had widened choice with the introduction of a	
	number of new subjects such as philosophy. Some schools set a hard and fast rule on the minimum	
	number of pupils required for a course to run. However, such a minimum could not be applied to a newly	

introduced subject where it may take some time for the new subject to develop a reputation and to "bed in". Therefore, there was no hard and fast rule, although clearly a cohort of 3-5 pupils was not sufficient to be efficient. It was also noted that there was no disadvantage to choosing a subject that ultimately did not run, as allocations of subject choice were not on a "first-come-first-served" basis.

Vision and Values

The Senate met on Monday the 20th with Mr Barnett presenting a summarized view of the School Council's feedback on the Vision and Values. (note the Council is approximately 40 strong comprising the School Captains with one representative per class; the Senate is approximately 15 strong with the School Captains and one representative per House)

They settled on three core values with a further two to be voted on from pride, fairness, kindness and equality/equity.
