School Improvement Plan SIP priorities – 4 main areas

- Redevelop antibullying policy Draft in place looking for 3-4 volunteers to for review body – meet w/Mr Cowling review and provide feedback
- Learning/teaching assessment: pupils appropriately challenged review of research lead approaches w/faculty breakouts
- Senior leaders conducting 74 learning visits in school. S3 focus due to ciric change
- Share of best practice on best observations.
- Circle framework introduction toolkit for staff to review how well they meet the
 needs of their pupils how to reflect and engage
- Curriculum staff review group 15 members of staff involved in reviewing change and update. Logistics review for next year.
- Tracking and monitoring better support teachers to digest data. Use of PowerBi.
 Aberdeen City data team to scope out exercise and work w/school to learn and roll out.

Exam performance / Insight data / Appeals

- Insight analysis released. Comparison against comparator. Ahead on all bar a few.
- Which behind? Literacy focus area STEM focus in Cults steering away from Literacy > Parliamentary motion to capture excellent results and positive outcomes from students across the range
- SQA appeals priority dependent on Uni appeals 1008 successful. 150 non priority 21 successful 14%. None marked down.

 S1/2/3 day trips as alternatives. S2 3 residential sites,20 not signed up.
- S3 5 residential trips well sorted on priority basis.
