- NPAs only to be taken in addition to Highers/FAs

Employment Pathway

 Employers will accept a range of qualifications including Highers, Nationals, NPAs, SFW and Foundation Apprenticeships

S5 Timetable

All S5 pupils study a full timetable – 30 periods per week + daily Tutor Time

- Pupils choose 5 subjects to continue from their S4 timetable or new subjects that do not require study at the previous level.
- Crash Highers in S5 are not recommended and in almost all cases will not be permitted.
- The expectation is that pupils complete the courses that they start.



Entry Requirements



- Choices are made based on final working grade (SQA Estimate Grade)
- Pupils who perform better than their estimate grade can make changes to their timetables in August



In School Support

PSE

- Completion of 'My Thoughts' section of the Course Choice Booklet.
- Emphasis on exploring;
 - 1. Subjects they enjoy.
 - 2. Subjects where they are attaining well.
 - 3. Subjects relevant to future career aspirations.



PT Pupil Support

- 1 to 1 meeting using the information captured in PSE and input from subject staff.
- PT Pupil Support will use their overview of pupil progress to ensure pupils are considering subjects where they will attain well. Pupils will be responsible for knowing entry requirements for desired pathway if known.



In School Support

Access to Careers Advisor

- Pupils can arrange an appointment with the career's advisor with emphasis given to exploring pupils';
 - 1. Key skills and strengths.
 - 2. Using these to explore employment sectors related to areas of interest.
 - 3. Linking school subjects to areas of interest.



Faculty Staff

- Give pupils a good indication of academic challenge of a subject and the pupil's suitability - (A/B - 'C')
- In addition, faculty staff will can give additional information about course content and structure as well as advising suitability for entry.

Subject Choice Process for pupils

Step 1: Look at the subject choice forms to see which courses are available

Step 2: Use the Pathway Planning website to research courses and entry requirements.

Do the same for College/University/Employment options.

Step 3: Seek advice from subject teachers, PTPS and Parents

Step 4: Decide your subjects

Step 5: Input your choices in the Google Form

Step 6: Complete any other application forms you need to e.g NESCOL, ABZ Campus or Foundation
